Trees ordered through this program may be used for any purpose--forestry, wildlife or ornamental plantings. **The deadline for ordering is January 31, 2012.** Trees will arrive in April of 2012 and will be disbursed at the Pierce County Fairgrounds. You will be notified, by postcard, when your trees are available for pick up. Please remember to pick up your order on the days as designated and tend to them as necessary. **This department is not responsible for the condition or availability of trees after pick-up dates!**

**CHERRY-NANKING (PRUNUS TOMENTOSA)** A broad spreading shrub. Pink to white flowers followed by edible scarlet fruit in June. Foliage is a very attractive soft green. Grows 8-10 feet. Spreads 6-10 feet.

**CRANBERRY-AMERICAN Highbush (VIBURNUM TRILOBUM)** Attractive foliage turns red and orange in the fall. Flat clusters of white flowers followed by red berries. Grows 8 feet. Spreads 8 feet.

**FIR-BALSAM (ABIES BALSAMEA-EASTERN STRAIN)** The traditional Christmas tree. Excellent fragrance with good needle retention. Prefers well-drained acidic, moist soil. Full to partial sun. Grows 40-60 feet. Spreads 20-25 feet.

**HAZELNUT (CORYLUS AMERICANA)** Small shrub often in clumps reaching 12 feet in height. Edible brown nuts. Grows best in moist, well-drained soils but will adapt to most types of soils. Full sun or deep shade. Attracts wildlife such as deer, grouse, turkeys, pheasants & quail. Grows 12 feet. Spreads 7 feet.

**MAPLE-SUGAR (ACER SACCHARUM)** Slow to medium growth. Outstanding native shade tree. Dark green leaves turn yellow to orange to fiery red in fall. Grows in most soil types. Sap used for maple syrup. Used for ornamental, lumber and wildlife habitat. Height-100 feet. Spreads 30-35 feet

**OAK-RED (QUERCUS RUBRA)** A wide massive shade tree. Fast growing and long-lived oak. This acorn tree provides food and shelter for wildlife and can tolerate city conditions. Also commercially valuable to the lumber market. Grows 80-90 feet. Spreads 45 feet.

**OAK-SWAMP WHITE (QUERCUS BICOLOR)** A species of oak with shiny dark green leaves. Yellow to purple fall color. Sweet acorns are great for wildlife. Does well in moist to wet soils, also in upland areas. Growth rate is moderate. Grows 65-80 feet. Spreads 50-60 feet.

**PINE-WHITE (PINUS STROBUS LAKE STATES)** Vigorous growing, open tree with long, soft bluish-green needles. Tolerates shade and grows well in sandy and other soils. Used in ornamental plantings. Grows over 35 feet. Spreads 40-50 feet.

**SPRUCE-NORWAY (PICEA ABIES)** Fastest growing pyramidal spruce with dark green needles and draping branches. Good ornamental or windbreak tree. Grows well in moist conditions. Grows 70-80 feet. Spreads 25-30 feet.

**SPRUCE-WHITE (PICEA GLAUCA LAKE STATES)** Moderate growing dense, pyramidal tree with bluish-green needles and short dense branches. Endures drought conditions well. Grows 60-80 feet. Spreads 10-20 feet.
