

How do I find out if someone is in the Pierce County Jail?

To find out if someone is in jail, you can look at the Pierce County Jail Roster or call (715) 273-1124 and select option "9".

How can I deposit money into an inmate's account?

There are two ways to deposit money into an inmate's account. You can deposit money using the kiosk machine that is located in the Jail Lobby. Cash or credit cards are accepted. You can also deposit money online with the use of a credit card at www.inmatecanteen.com. Each transaction will have a service fee of \$8.95 if using a credit card.

How can I communicate with an inmate?

Mail

Mail received at the Pierce County Jail must be addressed as follows:

Mail must have a return address including the name of the sender and complete address. Letters without a complete return address will be sent back to the post office. Please do not send expletive pictures, personal checks, property, stamps, or envelopes. Other items deemed contraband will be denied at staff's discretion.

Phone

Inmates have reasonable access to phones and kiosks which they can use to call their friends or family. Inmates must have money on their account to be able to use the phone. Phone calls are 18 cents per minute up to 20 minutes. Inmates can receive incoming calls to the housing area, but jail staff will not typically relay messages for inmates unless they have been deemed to be an emergency. You may deposit money into an inmate's account that they can use for phone time and canteen. Inmates cannot make "collect" phone calls.

Electronically

You have to create an account on www.inmatecanteen.com before you are allowed to have a video visitation with an inmate. You must fill out all the necessary information including your full name, address, telephone number, have a valid ID, and be at a computer station that can take a photo of you. Once you have successfully created an account, jail staff will review the submission and either accept or

deny your account. An explanation will be given as to why you were denied. All on-site visitations are free.

You may also video visit an inmate from home. These visits are not free of cost, video visits are 39 cents and are strictly a cost for the person at home.

Persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Be mindful that only one person may visit with an inmate at one time. If there are multiple people visiting with the inmate and are not signed up to visit, then jail staff may terminate the session. All calls are monitored so if there is excessive language, crude jesters, inappropriate dress attire, or exposure of nudity at any time then the call will be cancelled.

Monday and Thursday from 5:30pm-8:00pm

Saturday and Sunday from 1:00pm-4:00pm at the Pierce County Jail.

How do I post an inmate's bond?

Bonds can be paid with funds located in an inmate's account. You can make a deposit by visiting www.inmatecanteen.com or by utilizing the kiosk machine in the lobby of the jail. You can also pay an inmate's bond at the Clerk of Courts office during normal business hours.

Bonds paid by credit card have a limit of \$150.00 per transaction, and a maximum limit of \$500.00 per day. Each transaction will have a service fee of \$8.95 if using a credit card.

Notice Regarding Bond Posting

Prior to posting bond, you are advised that, if the defendant fails to comply with **ANY** conditions of the bond, the bond may be forfeited.

The bond could be forfeited for any violation, including but not limited to the following:

1. If the defendant fails to appear at **ANY** required court appearances.
2. If the defendant is ordered to have **NO CONTACT** with another person or place and the defendant has contact.
3. If the defendant commits another crime.
4. If the defendant has been ordered not to drive or not to consume alcoholic beverages and drives or consumes alcohol.

*****IF THE DEFENDANT IS FOUND GUILTY, THE COURT MAY APPLY THE BOND TO ANY RESTITUTION, FINES OR COSTS*****
