

How do I find out if someone is in the Pierce County Jail?

To find out if someone is in jail, you can call (715) 273-5051 and ask to speak to a jailer.

How can I deposit money into an inmate's account?

There are two ways to deposit money into an inmate's account. You can deposit money using the kiosk that is located in the Jail lobby. Cash or credit cards are accepted. You can also deposit money online with the use of a credit card at www.jailatm.com.

How can I communicate with an inmate?

Mail

Mail received at the Pierce County Jail must be addressed as follows:

Mail must have a return address including the name of the sender and complete address. Letters without a complete return address will be sent back to the post office. Please do not send Polaroid pictures, personal checks, property, stamps, or envelopes. Other items deemed contraband will be denied at staff's discretion.

Phone

Inmates have access to phones that they can use to call their friends or family. These calls are either "collect" or the inmate has to pay for them. Inmates cannot receive incoming calls and jail staff will not typically relay messages for inmates unless they have been deemed to be an emergency. You may deposit money into an inmate's account that they can use to purchase phone time.

Visitation

Saturday & Sundays 1:00pm- 4:00pm

Please ensure that you dress appropriately and bring a valid ID. Persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

How do I post an inmate's bond?

Bonds can be paid with funds located in an inmate's account. You can make a deposit by visiting www.jailatm.com or by utilizing the kiosk in the lobby of the jail. You can also pay an inmate's bond at the Clerk of Courts office during normal business hours.

Notice Regarding Bond Posting

Prior to posting bond, you are advised that, if the defendant fails to comply with ANY conditions of the bond, the bond could be forfeited.

The bond could be forfeited for any violation, including but not limited to the following:

1. If the defendant fails to appear at ANY required court appearances.

2. If the defendant is ordered to have NO CONTACT with another person or place and the defendant has contact.
3. If the defendant commits another crime.
4. If the defendant has been ordered not to drive or not to consume alcoholic beverages and drives or consumes alcohol.

IF THE DEFENDANT IS FOUND GUILTY, THE COURT MAY APPLY THE BOND TO ANY RESTITUTION, FINES, OR COSTS
