1b) Public Comment

D. Bergseng noted that 48% of the county's population resides in the townships and feels ARPA funds should be spent on broadband.

2) Establish & Adopt Agenda

Motion by J. Matthys/K. Fuchs to approve the agenda as presented; motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

3) Approve Minutes

Motion by J. Matthys/K. Fuchs to approve the minutes of August 16, 2022 as presented, motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

4) Presentation by Carah Koch on Broadband expansion activities and opportunities.

Carah Koch, Federal Program Officer for Wisconsin, provided background information regarding the Internet for All initiative. Koch also reviewed and answered questions on the Broadband Equity Access and Deployment (BEAD) Program which aims to close the access gap for unserved and underserved areas and community anchor institutions with grants as well as the State Digital Equity Planning Grant Program aimed to ensure individuals and communities have the skills and tools needed for full participation in the society and economy of the United States. Koch also highlighted the need for residents to review the new interactive map which shows availability of service at individual addresses and urges those who dispute the maps to submit a challenge to the FCC. Challenges must be submitted no later than January 13, 2023.

5) Discuss/take action to adopt an updated Project Scoring Matrix.

J. Matthys and G. Weaver gave an overview and answered question regarding the updated matrix and the intended process. J. Matthys noted there is approximately 4.3M of the ARPA Funds that have not been allocated yet with a growing list of project submissions currently totaling over 30M. Motion by K. Fuchs/K. Sampson to proceed with Phase 1 of the matrix for the existing submissions; motion carried unanimously by voice vote. J. Matthys to provide paper copies of all submission to committee members.

6) Review requests submitted since last meeting

J. Matthys noted there were 5 new requests since the last meeting. Three (3) received from the Ellsworth County Club requesting funds for shed maintenance, irrigation upgrade and shoreline restoration. Submission received requesting funds for revitalization of the Diamond Bluff Historic River Front Town Hall. Mel Pittman gave brief overview on his request for additional compensation for Pierce County Law Enforcement Officers working dispatch, jail and the sheriff's office during COVID.
